



## TRANSPARENCY IS INTENTIONALLY AVOIDED


With hundreds of new companies flooding the solar market every year no wonder it became a hassle for most homeowners to make an informed decision when choosing the right system for their home.


There is a massive issue around trust in the solar market as homeowners have been misled by commission-based salespeople, ending up with systems that are faulty, too big, too small, too expensive, disastrously financed and more.

With interest in solar on the rise there is a natural increase in companies entering the market to service the demand and an inevitable blend of "shonky" operators who are in it for a quick buck until the next new thing comes along.

One of the easiest ways to maximise their bottom line is to cut corners with the components and provide no transparency to customers in regards to the entire process.

Ethical business know and understand the vital role of trust in the long-term success of any relationship and the need for transparency to be a fundamental part of building that trust. This is a long game requiring more commitment, so when you find it in a solar provider you are likely in safe hands.









## BUYING A CHEAPER SYSTEM DOES NOT SAVE YOU MONEY

If a solar system seems too cheap to be true, then it probably is!

If you are being offered a cheap solar system, this is a significant red flag.

- Solar companies can't survive in business purely undercutting their competitors. Eventually they go out of business and won't be there to support you in the long-term.
- High risk of system failure within the first 3 years.
- Cheap components with no Australian presence are a warranty nightmare.
- Cost-cutting often means after-sales support and service is dropped.
- You can be pretty confident that the output of your system is compromised and financial losses incur for the lifetime of your system.
- Non CEC Accredited design and installation increasing your risk of danger, including fire.

Cheaper solar systems are only made possible by the manufacturer cutting corners. While higher quality components may result in your system being more expensive at the front end, they guarantee the longevity of your system (and hence return on investment) and your family's safety.

From a financial perspective, when you outlay for reputable, reliable, long-lasting parts at the front end with an accredited installer, you save yourself heartache, time and money on the back end. There's simply no way of getting around it.

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## BE AWARE OF ADDITIONAL COSTS

Some solar companies have clauses in their contracts that allow them to charge you extra for things like additional wiring, isolators and meter box upgrades. After receiving your quote, make sure you check for these and any other hidden costs. Ask if their quote includes everything you could possibly be charged for now and in the future and make sure all potential expenses are provided to you in writing.

If you are told that you need to have your system serviced once a year (or more) in order for the system to stay in warranty, please be aware that this is not true. In reality, all good-quality systems can easily be monitored via your smartphone, only need to be serviced once every 5 years and cleared of debris once per year. You can simply take care of this at the same time you do your gutters.
